

## Naruto, the City of Whirlpools and Joy

## A safe habitat for oriental white storks, a herald of joy and happiness

In February 2015, a pair of oriental white storks were spotted at a lotus root farm in Naruto City. Then, around the end of March 2017, some nestlings hatched in the city, the first oriental white storks to hatch in Japan outside of Toyooka City in Hyogo Prefecture, where efforts have been made to reintroduce them into the wild. Oriental white storks are seen as a herald of happiness in Japan, so this was welcome news for all Naruto citizens, and the baby birds have been accepted as special residents of the city. The fact that these oriental white storks, who are said to be vulnerable to environmental pollution, can live in Naruto hints at the city being a habitat with a rich and safe natural environment for oriental white storks and humans as well.



## The Uzu no Michi promenade on Onaruto Bridge

## Among the largest whirlpools in the world

The extraordinary whirlpools of Naruto are produced by a combination of the geographic particularities and rapid currents of the Naruto Strait.

The currents are caused by the tides, which repeat twice a day, causing counteracting flows in the water approximately every six hours.

While the whirlpools can be seen year-round, they can reach a size of 30 meters in diameter in spring and autumn, making them the world's largest.

A collection of over 1,000 masterpieces with timeless charms and beauty

OTSUKA MUSEUM OF ART boasts a unique collection of ceramic reproductions of masterpieces. It has over 1,000 pieces, ranging from classic to modern masterpieces of European fine arts, all reproduced in full size on ceramic panels.

Walking the 4-km path is like thumbing through an art book full of famous paintings from around the globe, including da Vinci's *Last Supper*, van Gogh's *Sunflowers*, and Picasso's *Guernica*.

# Local History and Religion



Ryozenji Temple, the first station of the Shikoku Pilgrimage



## Gokurakuji Temple, the second station

第二番札所 極楽寺

Located about 1 km west of Ryozenji Temple, this temple is home to a cedar tree believed to have been planted by Kobo Daishi himself. The main hall houses a 12th-century wooden Amida statue, a registered important cultural property.

## Oasahiko Shrine

大麻比古神社

Popularly known as Oasa-san, this shrine is the highest status shrine in Tokushima.

Its austere main hall is nestled away in a forest, where it welcomes the many visitors who come to pray. It is particularly lively during the first three days of the year.

## The Shikoku 88 Temple Pilgrimage

Born in Kagawa, Kobo Daishi (also known as Kukai) was one of the founders of Shingon Buddhism in the 8th and 9th centuries. As a young Buddhist, he walked every inch of Shikoku Island, a journey that later formed the basis for the 88 temples of the Shikoku Pilgrimage.

Future monks would follow his paths seeking enlightenment, and eventually ordinary people began to make pilgrimages as well. It was customary to affix a wooden tablet to a temple as a sign of passage. These spots are called *fudasho*, meaning tablet place. Today, instead of a tablet, pilgrims deposit a paper ticket or hand-copied sutra into a provided box.

Visiting a *fudasho* is referred to as “striking.” Depending on how the pilgrim approaches, it may be called a clockwise strike, counterclockwise strike, through strike, or staged strike.

You can spot pilgrims easily, as they often wear a conical hat inscribed with the characters 同行二人 *dogyo ninin*, meaning that they are accompanied by Kobo Daishi on their journey.



## Ryozenji Temple, the first station

第一番札所 靈山寺

As the starting point of the Shikoku Pilgrimage of Kobo Daishi, this temple is sometimes called *ichiban-san*, meaning starter. It is flocked with pilgrims dressed in white all year round.

## Naruto City Awa Dance Festival

鳴門市阿波おどり

In Tokushima, summer starts here in Naruto. Naruto City is the site of Tokushima's first Awa Dance Festival, which turns up the heat every year from August 9 to 11. The whole city catches dancing fever and the streets overflow with dancers, regulars and amateurs alike.

Niwaka-ren allows everyone to join in the dance!



What does  
*ren*  
mean?

*Ren* is the term for a group of Awa dancers. A *ren* may consist of enthusiasts or members of a social group, workplace, or school. It has both dancers and musicians (shamisen, bells, drums, flutes, etc.). If you want to experience dancing in a *ren* for yourself, Niwaka-ren welcomes members of the general public. You don't need special clothing to participate!

### tonaru SETO

Come watch a famous *ren* dance on the circular stage! Try raft fishing on the sea (gear included; reservation required). The former Seto Pre-school building was designed in the modernist style by architect Tomoya Masuda. Today, it serves as a pleasant place to relax.

# The history of friendship between Naruto and Germany

## The first place in Asia where Beethoven's Ninth Symphony was played was... right here in Naruto!

During World War I, about 1,000 German prisoners of war were housed in the Bando POW Camp in Naruto City. In the three years before their release, they formed orchestra, band, and choir groups and gave more than 100 concerts. On June 1, 1918, the German POWs organized a full concert in the camp of Beethoven's Ninth Symphony, which is about the love for mankind. This was the first ever performance of this symphony in Japan and Asia. Behind the historic performance was camp director Toyohisa Matsue, who treated the prisoners with extraordinary human kindness, as well as the hospitality of the local people. Even today, the people of Naruto City speak proudly of this history of friendship even during wartime.



## Cenotaph for German soldiers

The cenotaph was erected by the German POWs themselves to mourn their comrades who passed away in custody. It is registered as a cultural heritage site of Tokushima Prefecture. It stands next to another cenotaph that is dedicated to all German POWs who died in Japanese prisoner camps.

## The Naruto German House

鳴門市ドイツ館

The Naruto German House was constructed to commemorate the friendship between the locals and the German POWs who were housed in the Bando POW Camp from 1917 to 1920. It archives many invaluable items from the time.

With videos, models, dioramas, robots, and many other attractions, it makes for a fascinating visit. In the Ninth Symphony Theater, life-size mannequins demonstrate how the German POWs played music.

The building was originally constructed as a barracks at the Bando POW Camp during World War I. It is registered as a national tangible cultural property and it retains the ambiance of the time. Inside, you can buy locally sourced fresh produce.

## The German Bridge

ドイツ橋

This arched bridge crosses over the Bandodani River on the grounds of Oasahiko Shrine. Located behind the shrine, this 9.6-meter bridge was constructed by German prisoners at the Bando POW Camp, using a masonry arch technique that was not known in Japan at the time. It was registered as a cultural heritage site of Tokushima Prefecture on January 30, 2004.



## Naruto City Kagawa Toyohiko Memorial Museum

鳴門市賀川豊彦記念館

Toyohiko Kagawa (1888–1960), who spent his youth in Naruto City, was a key figure in the democratization of Japan in the early 20th century. Kagawa was always driven by his belief in love, cooperation, and peace. He was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize and the Nobel Prize in Literature.

The museum was founded through civic donations from people who hoped to carry on his spirit and celebrate his life achievements.

## The history of Otani Ware dates back to the late Edo period

The origins of Otani Ware are attributed to Bunemon, an 18th-century pottery artisan from Bungo Province (now Oita Prefecture), who first made pottery in Otani using local red clay.


The traditional method is for the potter's assistant to lie on their side and use their feet to turn the large potter's wheel. Otani Ware was designated as a national traditional handicraft in 2003.

Today, Otani Ware teacups and other ceramic pieces are loved for their rustic appearance. Some kilns offer pottery workshops for visitors.




